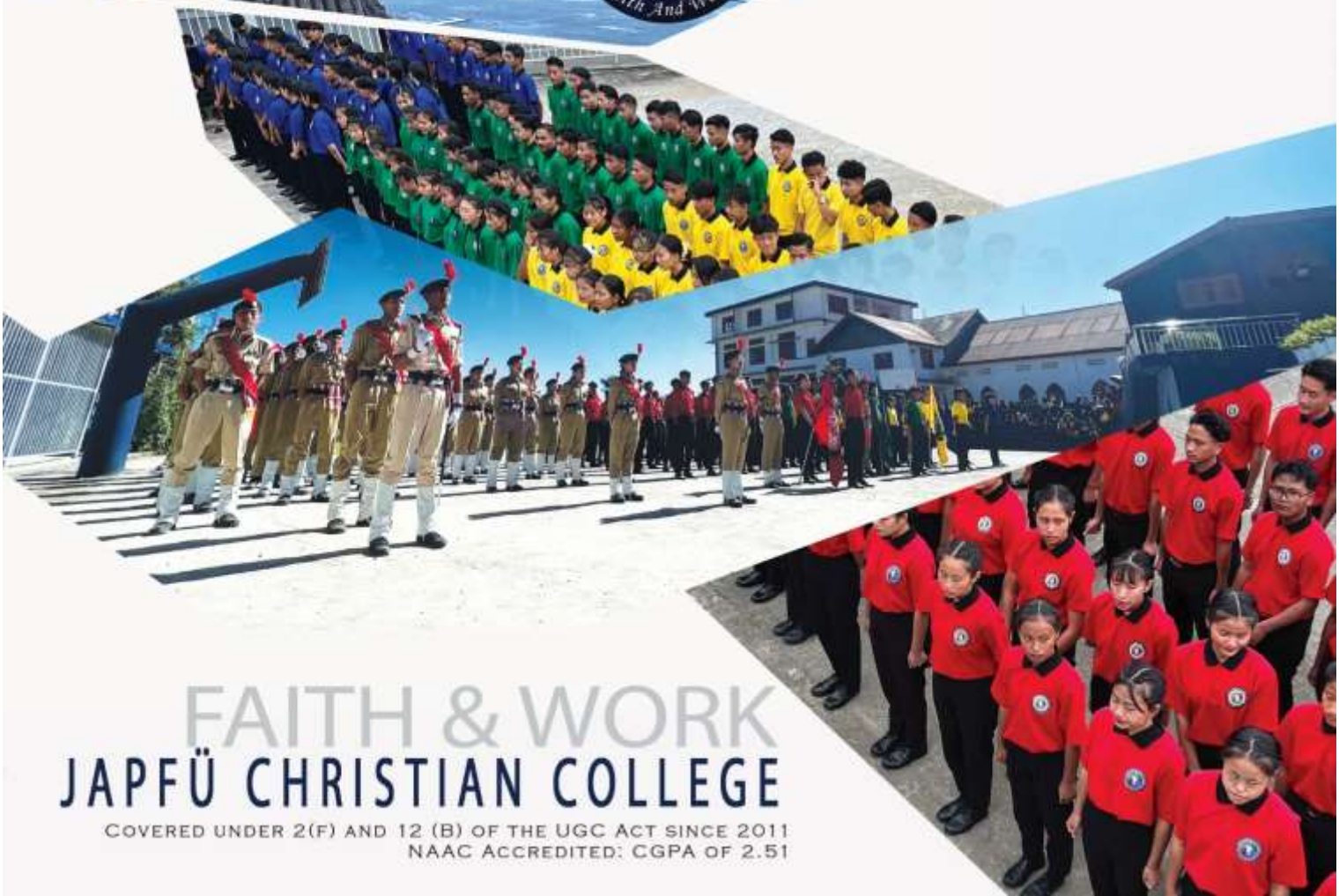

Nestled in the foothills of the majestic Japfü Mountain, echoing the spirit of its surroundings—majestic, inspiring, and culturally rich, **JAPFÜ CHRISTIAN COLLEGE (JCC)** stands as a beacon of Academic Excellence and holistic development.

JCC is a residential co-educational institute offering degree programs at the Undergraduates and Post Graduates' Level. Included in the curriculum are add-on courses designed to enhance and promote skills for employability and preservation of Indigenous knowledge system.

Japfü Christian College, envisioned in 1996, is now a premiere Higher Education institute in the state of Nagaland and pioneering in a plethora of diverse distinctive; ranging from traditional research and skill based education to environmental preservation and biodiversity. JCC is accredited by NAAC with CGPA of 2.51 on a four-point scale at B+ grade.

GOAL

INSTRUCTIONS FOR PAYMENT OF FEES FOR SEMESTER SYSTEM

Installments

The installments for semester system are Tuition Fee and Room Rent.

1. The Odd Semester Installment is to be paid after two months of class commencement.
 2. Even Semester Installment is to be paid on commencement of semester.
- * *Fee payment notice may be served for total clearance prior to internal/external exams. *
Non-payment of fees will result in with-holding of Admit Cards/Results/Mark sheets of
College/NU/NBSE.*
- * *Hostel Room Rent will be taken in full for 6 months for Semester, irrespective of
occupancy.*

Annual Fees

1. Pay the Annual Fees in full at the time of admission.
2. No admissions shall be allowed, under any circumstances, without full clearance of Annual Fees.

College Uniform

1. White Shirt, Black Pants, Black Socks, Black Formal Shoes, College Necktie, Badge & Muffler (Monday –Thursday). * College T. Shirts/Class Hoodies, if available, can wear on Wednesdays with college blazer/black pants/black socks/black formal shoes.
2. Cultural Fridays (1st, 3rd & 5th Fridays): Any decent attire with Traditional touches: Tribal Stoles/ conspicuous tribal necklaces/ headgears.
3. Fitness Fridays (2nd & 4th Fridays): Decent Casual wear.
4. During Exams, Students will use full College uniform and will not wear College T. Shirt, Class Hoodies or Traditional attires worn during Cultural Fridays.

Mess Fee

1. Pay the full month's Mess Fee at the time of admission/Arrival. Balance, if any, are adjusted at course end or as notified by Mess management.
2. Pay each month's Mess Fee on or before 10th of every month, failing which a fine of ₹ 10/- (Ten) only shall be charged for every defaulting day. Parents or Legal Guardian are to notify authority in case of genuine problems.
3. Mess Fee advance payment notice may be served for total clearance prior to internal/ external exams.
4. Non-payment of Mess Fees for 2 consecutive months will invite Parents/Guardians' Call.

FREE STUDENTSHIP

1. College offers free studentship to select students from economically disadvantaged Families/differently-abled students/ JCC Staff & Faculty's, JBCC Full time Ministry Workers' children by waiving Tuition fee/Room rent.
2. Free studentship is extended to one member if three or more students are from the same family.

REFUNDING RULES

GENERAL

1. Annual Fees shall not be refunded after Admission.
2. Students will need to take blazer measurement on time. Blazer money is not refundable as it is collected and handed over to tailors.
3. Cancellation of Admission before commencement of Classes shall be refunded the First Installment.
4. After the commencement of classes the Installment shall not be refunded.
5. After the commencement of class, there shall be no refunding of installment for semester system.

MESS FEE

1. No refunding of Mess Fee for late coming under normal circumstances. But if late coming is due to any extraordinary reasons like own hospitalization, death of immediate family member or much publicized roadblocks, the same should be reported to the Principal/Vice Principal in writing for decision.
2. If a hosteller is permitted leave 8 or more days by the Resident Officer concerned, the grantee shall be refunded daily Mess Fee of ₹ 100/- per day provided the application is forwarded by the Resident Officer and duly approved by the Principal.
3. Mess Fees during arrivals/departures/ Exam Days are fixed as:
 - i. 1-5 Days : ₹ 500/-
 - ii. 6-10 Days : ₹ 1000/-
 - iii. 11-15 Days : ₹ 1500/-
 - iv. 15-20 Days : ₹ 2000/-

COLLEGE RULES

A. Offences leading to expulsion from the College

9. Violation of Kigwema village rules, especially on Forest Fire related issues.
10. Violation of College rules after Last Warning.
11. Last Day Misbehavior by any students will be remarked as expelled in their Transfer Certificate/ Character Certificate. Documents will be handed over only to parents/legal guardian after formal apology by the erring student.
12. Any other serious misbehavior deserving expulsion.

B. Offences leading to Last Warning

1. Indifference to warnings.
2. Negligence of Examinations.
3. Misbehavior in Examinations even without evidential proof.
4. Being a bad influence on others.
5. Boy-Girl Intimacy.
6. Poor Attendance
7. Expulsion from Hostel.
8. Use of intoxicants (Day scholars).
9. Forgery (Signature).
10. Union /Association/Organization formation without College permission.
11. Taking harmful issues to the media without prior written permission from Principal.
12. Any other misbehavior deserving last warning.

C. Offences leading to Fine per Catch: College

1. Missing Chapel (₹ 50)
2. Crossing Boundary fencing without using College Main Gate. (₹ 200)
3. Use of tobacco products in any form. [₹ 20]
4. Breaking big/ small window pane (s) (Unintentional) to be replaced and fine amount as per the cost of replacement
5. Non- wearing of Uniform (₹ 50 per day: Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday (T.S), Thursday).
6. Late Submission of Library Books (₹ 10 per day).
7. Late arrival for First Day Class: (₹ 200)
8. Inappropriate use of mobile phones: First catch: ₹ 200- OR 1-week mobile confiscation.

D. Attendance, Examination & Admission Rules

1. Non-attendance of Classes/ coaching classes/Non-Payment of Fees/Dues/Non-submission of Assignments/ Remedial Coaching Class/ Negligence of Internal Exams; will lead to with-holding of Admit Cards (Internal, Final exams), debarring the defaulting candidate from appearing the College/ NU exam.
2. Any serious misbehavior by students during exam period will disqualify his/her candidature or even non-issuance of Mark sheet/ Result/Transfer Certificate.
3. Risks Admissions are taken for BA Semester classes even prior to the declaration of NU Results so as to increase working days.
4. Admission to the next semester shall be permitted as per NU Rules only.
5. Every even semester, Students failing to achieve minimum attendance will come under “NOT TO RETURN” category.

10. Late arrival for Hostel: (₹ 200)

C. Offences leading to Warning

3. Tampering of granted leave letters.
4. Any other misbehavior that deserves warning.

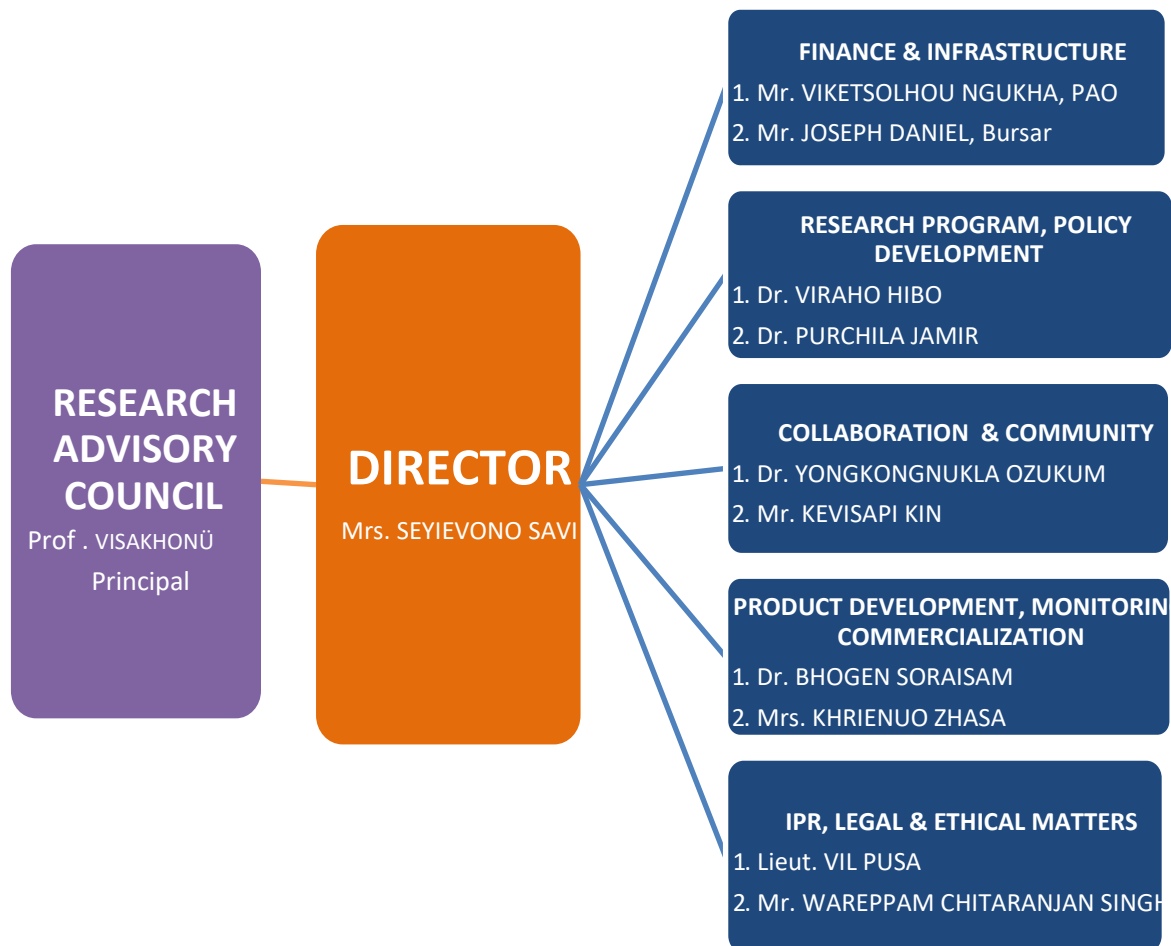
